Dear Classmates:



YOUR input is needed for a special Reunion Panel ! — details from Betsy Gardner '77

"But now I am Six-ty-ish, I'm as clever as clever..." (...with apologies to A. A. Milne and to the Ada Comstock and precocious younger members of the Class of '77, who may be older or younger than that.)

Some of us are feeling none too clever at the moment, despite the hours we spend trying to absorb and metabolize the day's news. And it's likely that many of us aren't focusing much, if at all, on our reunion weekend. Here's hoping that most of us will find our way to Northampton in May. We have a unique opportunity to discuss our thoughts about wise approaches to life, 40 years after graduation.

To provide the raw material for that discussion, **you'll receive a 'wisdom survey'' in the next few weeks** via the email address you have provided to Smith. It contains a link through which you may access the survey at your convenience over the following month. It's anonymous, unless you choose to identify yourself, and the questions seek to get at our ideas about what we need to know in life, whether we think we know it now, learned it anywhere in particular, have to keep learning it, and if so, how: through important books, people, courses, experiences, practices? The survey will be fairly brief, with a few demographic bones, a few <u>Likert</u> scale questions, but primarily open-ended queries because we want to hear what we all think in our own words.

Our responses will be reviewed in advance through the <u>Smith College Qualtrics site</u> (again, it's ANONYMOUS!) by our distinguished panelists, who will meet with us on **May 20 from 1-3 in Alumnae House** to provide their respective impressions of our answers as a springboard to what we expect will be a robust and candid discussion among the women assembled. Bring your box lunch, if you'd like!
